The great Katherine Johnson was the subject of my assembly with the children this week, an inspirational woman we study in Year 5. Born in West Virginia in 1918 she overcame significant racial and gender hurdles to make giant leaps for mankind. She worked tirelessly to master her maths and at 34 joined NASA where she helped calculate the trajectory for the first human spaceflight and later, the path for Neil Armstrong's Apollo 11 mission. A wonderful example of how barriers can be overcome through resilience, determination and dedication.

It was also timely considering the report released regarding English cricket this week. Whilst much progress has been made since Katherine Johnson first helped put a man on the moon, there are sections of society where discrimination is still rooted. As educator and civil rights activist Maya Angelou once said, 'Prejudice is a burden that confuses the past, threatens the future and renders the present inaccessible.' It is our duty as parents, carers and educators to ensure that the future for our children is not threatened, but a wonderful opportunity to fulfil their dreams and contribute positively as global citizens. Education has a vital role in fulfilling that aim and we take that as both our responsibility and privilege. Our ambition is not just for Highfield children to understand the challenges Katherine Johnson overcame, but to take the baton and set the example for society to follow.

#### **Proposed Strike Action update for parents**

RE: The NEU (National Education Union) planned strike dates on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

Dear Parents and Carers,

In preparation for the strike days next week, I would like to state my planned course of action to keep you fully informed. The strike action is a result of a national pay dispute between the NEU and the Government. It is a matter for the NEU and the Government to resolve independently of the school.

The procedure at Highfield will be as follows:

At the earliest opportunity, I will send out a Parentmail to all parents advising them of whether or not their child's class is open or closed.

Whilst we will do all that we can to minimise disruption, we would advise you to begin considering alternative childcare arrangements, where needed, for the above dates should your child's class be closed. I realise that is not the ideal situation, however the purpose of strike action is to cause disruption in order to highlight their cause hence why I am not entitled to know the intentions of NEU members.

I will keep you updated with developments and the arrangements for the planned strike day as soon as I am able to do so. As soon as I know, you will know. I can assure you of that.
