Headteacher's Message

I want to draw your attention to a fantastic new podcast by our very own Mr Brassil called 'Chalk Talk'. Mr Brassil is our pedagogy lead at Highfield; pedagogy being the theory and practice of teaching and learning. Episode 1 is all about memory; understanding memory and its role in children's learning is crucial for educators and parents.

Children have limited working memory capacity. This means they can only hold and process a small amount of information at a time. Teachers need to plan for this in their practice and ensure children are not overloaded in order to facilitate learning. Equally, teachers need to ensure children are challenged and 'thinking hard' in order for them to reach their potential – that is the skill of teaching. Remember that every child is unique and what works best for one may not work for another but fostering a love for learning and curiosity can go a long way in enhancing children's memory.

Pedagogy is constantly evolving as researchers and educators discover new insights into how children learn best. We aim to stay informed about the latest pedagogical evidence to enable us as educators to provide the best possible learning experiences for Highfield children. Mr Brassil leads this and has already been endorsed by some of the most celebrated in this field! Have a listen – 5 minutes of brilliant insight!
