Reading: Year 1 children are given two books per week to read which are given out on a Friday. Please ensure that you listen to your child read the books and make a note in their reading records that they have read and any other feedback you wish to give.

Seesaw homework/spellings: This will be set on a Monday to be completed by the following Monday. This task should take about 10 minutes and is uploaded online. It will be directly related to the phonics we will be learning that week in class. The sound will be explained plus any rules that apply for using the sound. We would like you to help your child think of some words with these sounds in, write the words out in their neatest cursive handwriting and then as an extra challenge to put the word into a sentence.

ENGLISH

We will write about our book "The Tiger who came to tea". We will write instructions for making biscuits, setting description for "We're going on a bear hunt" and letters inspired by the "Smeds and the Smoos".

PHONICS

We will re-cap the sounds covered in Reception. We will then begin to look at alternatives for some of these sounds. Phonics learning will be supported by homework on Seesaw.

ART/ DT

We will study natural pattern and the leaf artist Lorenzo Duran. We will make biscuits and design, make and evaluate our own calendar with a flap and a lever.

MUSIC – We will think about the sounds that are all around us, we will make some firework percussion and become familiar with some of the percussion instruments.**PSHE** – Mental health and emotional well being – Mindmate. Keeping safe and managing risk.

COMPUTING

The first half term we will learn how to program a Beebot. The second half term we will begin to learn to log on to a computer and save work. We will also begin to learn about online safety.

MATHS

We will be learning about place value within 10 and 20. We will learn about addition and subtraction within 10 and solving simple number problems. We will also learn about shape and pattern.

SCIENCE

We will learn about "ourselves", body parts and our senses. We will look at which sense is associated with which body part. We will study the seasonal changes that occur during Autumn.

HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

We will learn about countries of the UK and the weather we see in the UK during Autumn. We will learn about the gun powder plot and a history of toys from living memory.

RE

We will learn about ourselves and celebrations. Celebrations of Harvest, Diwali, Bonfire night, Remembrance Day, Guru Nanak's birthday, Hanukkah and Christmas.

PΕ

The first half term we will learn about movement and static balance. The second half term we will learn ball skills and games.

WAYS YOU CAN HELP AT HOME

- Making sure your child remembers to bring a water bottle every day & comes to school with all day (8 hour) suncream on & a sun hat in hot/sunny weather.
- Talk to your child about their day-this can have a huge impact on your child and gives them an opportunity to reflect on their day and their learning.

School starts at 8.55am. Getting your child to school on time really matters. Arriving late is upsetting for your child and disruptive for the rest of the class.

Being regularly late adds up to a loss of learning time.

5 mins late everyday = over 3 days of learning lost every year 10 mins late everyday = over 7 days of learning lost every year 15 mins late everyday = over 2 weeks of learning lost every year 20 mins late everyday = nearly 3 weeks of learning lost every year 30 mins late everyday = over 4 weeks of learning lost every year
