This term the children will be supported by Mrs Vine. She will teach 5L on Tuesday and Friday afternoons and 5E on Thursday afternoons.

Homework

Reading: Year 5 children are expected to read for 20 minutes four times a week. Books are will be changed by the children as and when they have finished. There are a wide range of fiction, non-fiction books in the classroom for children to choose from as well as our central library.

Spellings: Children will be given a set of spellings each Thursday, which are set on Seesaw and should be practised at home. We will be using the spellings in many different ways throughout the week to aid learning. The children will be tested formally the following Thursday.

Seesaw homework: This will be set on a Thursday to be completed by the following Tuesday. We will set one piece of maths homework, which will be linked to the lessons completed that week and a second piece, which will either be curriculum or English based. Each task should take around 30 minutes to complete and should be uploaded to Seesaw.

ENGLISH Our year group novel this term is 'The Emergency Zoo'. We will read and complete activities based on this book and it will inform some of our extended writing this term. We will begin to develop the children's vocabulary, investigate spelling rules and year 5 grammar. We will learn to write, descriptions, cinquain poetry, non-chronological reports and newspaper reports.

SCIENCE Life cycles is the first topic of the year we will be studying. Within this we will study the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds and look at the size of mammals and how this affects their gestation periods. Our annual pond study of the school pond will start this term. After the half term break, we will investigate forces and their impact on every day life.

ART / DT Art in year 5 this term, will focus on Clarice Cliffe and Art Deco, which will link to our WW2 topic. The children will be designing their own sugar shakers, using a variety of mediums. We will also study Art Deco inspired designs and creating our own cityscapes using the Art Deco style.

MUSIC

Music lessons this term will link to our WW2 history topic. We will listen to, compare and analyse music from the time period. After half term, rehearsal for the Christmas production will begin.

COMPUTING This term, we will be learning all about how networks work. As part of our online safety lessons, we will all write and sign a digital citizenship pledge stating that they will use the internet safely and in the right way and how to create a strong, safe password.

MATHS-We will be focussing on the value of digits up to 1,000,000, rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000, 100,000. Adding and subtracting 4-digit numbers. We will be interpreting charts, line graphs, two-way tables and timetables. After the half-term break, we will teach the children about multiples, factors, prime numbers, multiplying & dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000. Finally, we will look at how to measure perimeter and area.

HISTORY This term we will be studying what life for a child was like during WW2. We will look closely at evacuation, air raid shelters, reflecting on real-life experiences from the time and looking at propaganda posters.

RE Mrs Vine will teach RE this term. Forgiveness, and how it is taught in the 4 religions that are studied in KS2 will be taught in Autumn 1. After half term, is how important events are remembered by pilgrimages and why people go on pilgrimages.

PE Swimming will take place on Friday's for 5E in Autumn 1 and in Autumn 2 for 5L. Whilst not at swimming, children will be learning the skills and rules for netball and hockey. Indoor PE will be skills based learning cognitive and creative skills.

MFL This year, we will be using a new programme of study called 'Language Angels'. This will allow the children to focus on their French oracy skills and develop their fluency when speaking the language.

PSHE In PSHE this term, we will be focussing on our mental health. How we can make ourselves happy, what a healthy relationship looks like, how to cope with life changes and how to solve problems that arise.

Ways you can help at home

- Making sure your child remembers to bring a water bottle every day & comes to school with all day (8 hour) suncream on & a sun hat in hot/sunny weather.
- Talk to your child about their day-this can have a huge impact on your child and gives them an opportunity to reflect on their day and their learning.
- Reading with your child on a regular basis and asking them questions about what they have read and ensuring their reading book is brought to school every day.
- Times Table-After Christmas, times tables are vital to all of the work that we complete in Maths.

Practising these at home this term, will be an incredible help to the children for the work that they will be completing in in the Spring and Summer terms.

Don't be late through the gate!

School starts at 8.55am. Getting your child to school on time really matters. Arriving late is upsetting for your child and disruptive for the rest of the class.

Being regularly late adds up to a loss of learning time.

5 mins late everyday = over 3 days of learning lost every year

10 mins late everyday = over 7 days of learning lost every year

15 mins late everyday = over 2 weeks of learning lost every year

20 mins late everyday = nearly 3 weeks of learning lost every year

30 mins late everyday = over 4 weeks of learning lost every year
