Mathematics

Number

Number and place value

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards from any given number.
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Identify one more or less from a given number.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including a number line.
- Use the language: equal to, more than, less than, fewer, most, least.
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.

Addition and subtraction

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition, subtraction and equals including their signs.
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts to 20.
- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20.
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using objects and pictorial representations and missing number problems.

Multiplication and division

Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using objects, pictorial representations and arrays withthe support of the teacher.

Fractions

- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.



Measurement

- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for:
- Length and height (long/short, double/half, tall/short)
- Mass/weight (heavy/light)
- Capacity and volume (full/empty, half/quarter)
- Time (quicker, slower, earlier, later)
- Measure and begin to record:
- length and height
- mass/weight
- capacity and volume
- time (hours, minutes, seconds)
- Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- Sequence events in chronological order using language (before, after, next, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon, evening.)
- Recognise and use language relating to dates including days of the week, weeks, and months of the year.
- Tell the time to the hour and half past and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Geometry

Properties of shapes

- Recognise and name common 2D shapes (rectangle, square, circle, triangle)
- Recognise and name common 3D shapes (cuboids, cube, pyramids, sphere)

Position and direction

Describe position, direction and movement including whole, half, quarter and three quarter turns.
