Thinking time whilst coming into assembly:

What are these? Where have you thought about them before?

The children were then asked to think about how each of these British values is linked to what we say, how is what we say important? The children gave some great answers linking liberty to freedom of speech and how we need to be respectful when we speak.

Words are so powerful. I gave the example of just one word: rubbish. In pairs, the children discussed how this made them feel and fed back. I then gave them the word 'chocolate' and in pairs the children discussed the difference in feelings. This was a way of showing how powerful just one word can be. So imagine how powerful lots of words are and how they can make a positive difference.

4 children then came out to the front and read part of the poem 'Human Beings' aloud to the whole school. It was chosen as the poem people would most like to send into space to be read by the Universe! I asked the children to think about what message the poet was trying to get across whilst they listened.

We discussed their feelings about the poem. Then gave the final message:

The differences between us is tiny compared to how much makes us the same.

We are all human.
