We encourage you to listen to your child read regularly.

Spellings: Children will be given a set of spellings each Friday to be brought home and practised. These will be on Seesaw. We will be using the spellings in many different ways throughout the week to aid learning. The children will be tested in school the following Thursday.

There will be a balance of English, Maths and Topic work throughout the year. We also encourage your children to access Times Tables Rock Stars at home. ENGLISH

This term, we will be writing Egyptian fairy tales and a piece of historical fiction based on Howard Carter's excavation of Tutankhamun's tomb. We will be recapping conjunctions and noun phrases, and applying our knowledge of the present perfect as well as adverbs and prepositions.

SCIENCE

We will be learning about the parts of a plant and their function. We will also be learning about rocks and soils in our local area.

ART / DT

We will be making our own Egyptian sarcophagus toy using a pneumatic system and exploring ancient Egyptian art through sculpture, painting and drawing.

MUSIC

The children will be continuing to learn how to play the ukulele this term. We will learn how to play simple chords and begin to combine them to play songs. We will also be performing the play of Joseph which involves lots of singing!

COMPUTING

This term, we will be using Scratch to program a game with a car that moves around a track, and creating an Egyptian animation.

MATHS

Year 3 will be learning how to multiply 2-digit and 1-digit numbers, using a formal column method. We will also be learning how to divide these numbers. We will learn about perimeter and begin our learning on fractions. We will be learning how to make 1, as well as identifying fractions of shapes and amounts.

HISTORY / GEOGRAPHY

Year 3 will be learning about the ancient civilization of ancient Egypt. We will learn about the Nile, mummification, Egyptian Gods, communication and art.

RE

Year 3 will be learning about the cultural beliefs, festivals and practices of the Jewish community.

PΕ

We will be creating an Egyptian dance based on hieroglyphs and practising throwing and catching as well as balancing. We will also be exploring symmetry and asymmetry in gymnastics.

MFL

This term the children will continue their weekly French lessons. We are learning how to say the names of instruments in French as well as say, "I am able to..." and "I know how to..."

WAYS YOU CAN HELP AT HOME

- Reading with your child on a regular basis and asking them questions about what they have read, particularly questions that allow them to give more detailed answers.
- Helping your child to practise their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables regularly.
- Making sure your child remembers to bring a water bottle every day.
- Ensuring all clothes are named, including P.E. kits.
- Helping your child to access Seesaw and post their work online.

Don't be late through the gate!

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School starts at 8.55am. Getting your child to school on time really matters. Arriving late is upsetting for your child and disruptive for the rest of the class.

Being regularly late adds up to a loss of learning time.

5 mins late everyday = over 3 days of learning lost every year 10 mins late everyday = over 7 days of learning lost every year 15 mins late everyday = over 2 weeks of learning lost every year 20 mins late everyday = nearly 3 weeks of learning lost every year 30 mins late everyday = over 4 weeks of learning lost every year
