This triangulation process is how we collect evidence about our pupils' learning and helps us understand what we are doing well and how we can improve. We have enjoyed seeing formative assessment strategies employed consistently across all subjects and, most pleasingly, the articulation of their learning by our children. Oracy is the second target on our school development plan (https://highfield-primary.co.uk/our-school/school-improvement-plan/) not only for academic reasons, but also because having the skills and confidence to speak up and believe in yourself has been shown to enhance our sense of happiness and well-being. Communicating effectively is a key skill for life.
