Thinking time whilst coming into assembly: Diversity is our strength. Can you remember what diversity means? This is a link to last week's assembly and seeing what the children could remember.



There was also a bonus question! Could they remember what well-being is?

What word links these three important parts of our school culture:



Respect. All the children were then asked to write on their (imaginary) whiteboards what this meant to them. How did they show it? How did they show it through speech, actions and their care for the environment? What about respect for learning?

After getting lots of great feedback we then answered the following together:

- To speak respectfully...
- To behave respectfully...
- To respect the school environment...
- To have respect for your own learning...
- To have respect for other students' learning...

We then shared a poem. Some volunteer children were then selected to come out to the front and read it aloud:

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If we can not respect another How can we expect them to respect us If we can not respect someone's beliefs How can we expect them to respect ours If we can not respect another's race How can we expect that race to respect us If we can not respect others How can we expect respect in return How do we show this respect?

Everyone expects respect No matter who they are The only way to gain it Is to start treating everyone As a friend, a brother, a sister As part of our extended family No matter what colour or creed they are Only then you will start to get The respect you so dearly crave
