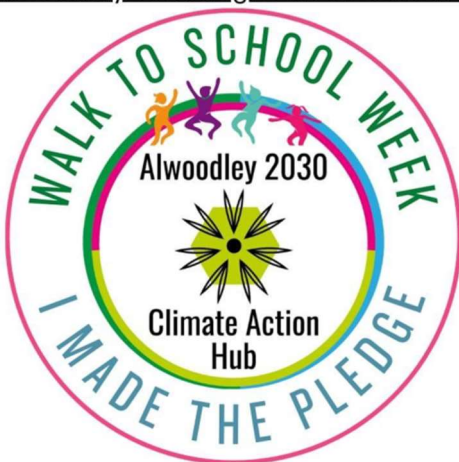
Walk to school week

Harmony in Diversity Breakfast

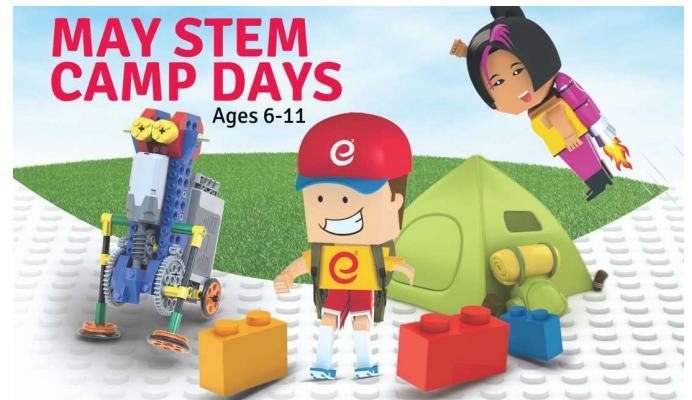

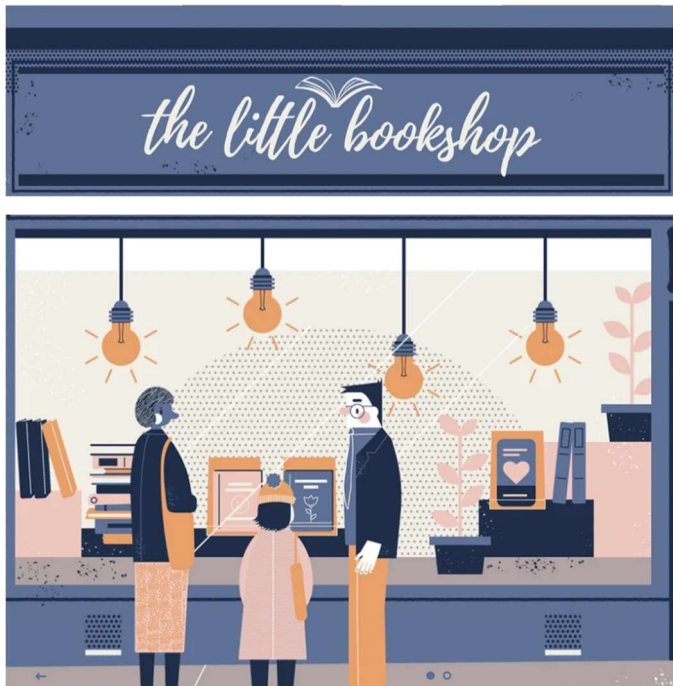
