Headteacher's Message

Welcome to the new school year! It has been great to see the children back and enjoying their first week.

I thought I would share with you some of our work this week. 'Mindset' is a commonly used phrase when discussing attitudes and confidence. How to promote a positive mindset is a complex and challenging area but one the staff at Highfield are constantly looking to improve. We started our training day on Monday by thinking about how confirmation bias can be a barrier to a healthier mindset and how we might change that.

Children often experience confirmation bias, where they seek out information that **supports** their preexisting beliefs (as adults often do on social media!). This tendency is a natural part of **cognitive development**, as children are still learning how to process complex information and often rely on familiar patterns of thinking. To combat this, it's crucial that we encourage **open-mindedness** and teach our children to evaluate **diverse perspectives**.

One way we repeatedly promote this at Highfield, is by encouraging a *culture of error*. A culture of error in the classroom is an environment where mistakes are viewed as **opportunities for learning**, rather than failures. We want our children to feel safe to take risks, make errors and receive constructive feedback, fostering growth and improvement without fear of judgment. We praise the **effort**, rather than the **outcome**.




Free books
