

## Headteacher's Message

This week I attended a Primary Leaders conference where the opening think piece involved a picture of Elon Musk and Donald Trump embracing and we were asked to think about the possible outcomes of this relationship for our children. History has taught us that marriages of convenience in politics rarely end well. However, Musk's substantial reach through platforms like X (and now Government) means in the short term at least we may see him contributing to social attitudes which parents and educators need to be aware of. We discussed how, in the past, Musk has posted comments to X which could be interpreted as misogynistic as he has mocked progressive social movements such as feminism. Such attitudes can lead to issues such as online harassment, discrimination and gender parity being normalised. Andrew Tate is one recent example of how powerful such influences can be.

Countering the rise of harmful influences is not straightforward, but teaching our children to safeguard themselves is the greatest defence in my opinion. By fostering inclusive environments as we strive to do at Highfield, we keep respect and empathy at our core which reduces the impact of toxic material. But by also fostering critical thinking and media literacy, we can help our children make informed decisions about the information they consume. As a parent I appreciate the intent behind the Australian Governments proposal to ban social media for under 16's, but as an educator I worry it could stifle children's ability to navigate a digital world independently and critically evaluate content. Also, we must not forget that not all social media is bad – it provides us with an opportunity to learn about different global perspectives, access diverse ideas and engage in alternative education streams. Balance is required.
