### Celebrating the Languages of Leeds at Highfield

Did you know that, according to the Office for National Statistics, over **170 languages** are spoken across Leeds? Even more impressively, **every one of these language groups is represented in the Moortown ward**—with the sole exception of Turkish Sign Language (I am happy to stand corrected if anyone knows different!). What an incredible tapestry of language and culture we are part of!

At **Highfield**, we are proud to reflect and celebrate this rich linguistic diversity. As we approach **Leeds City of Languages** this November—an exciting celebration hosted by the University of Leeds—we want to shine a spotlight on the many languages spoken, heard and learned by our children and families. We know how proud our children are of their heritage and their connections to languages beyond English. That's why I'm working to further develop and raise the profile of our school's linguistic diversity. I encourage all families to cherish and preserve their language links—it's a gift worth celebrating.

As part of **Leeds Language Week**, there's a **multilingual poetry competition** taking place across the city, but we want to bring that celebration right here to Highfield! I'm inviting all our children to take part in our very own **Multilingual Poetry Challenge**.

Here's how it works:

- Write a poem in **any language other than English** at home and bring it to school.
- Include a **translation or explanation** in English to help us all understand and appreciate it.
- The poem can be about **anything**—from nature to family, dreams to favourite foods!
- For our children who only speak English, why not have a go at writing a poem in different language of your choice.

We'll be creating a beautiful **display board** in our newly decorated hall to showcase all the entries. It's a wonderful opportunity to celebrate the voices and stories that make our school community so special. **Parents and carers**—your support is invaluable! Please encourage your children to take part and help them with translations if needed. Let's make this a celebration to remember!

### Highfield Signposting

#### Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

#### What this means for you:

- If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.
- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

We will continue to share updates from the publisher as more information becomes available.

Thank you for your support in keeping our children safe.
